

Adventure Activity Leadership Residential Courses

Outdoor Instructor Training Course : 1 year

Who is this course for?

This one year fully residential outdoor instructor training course takes students through an exciting journey of training and assessments with an intensive programme of tuition and consolidation time, a six week block of time in Switzerland in the winter and 12 weeks of work placement in the summer.

The course is primarily aimed at Christians looking for a career in outdoor activity instruction but many other people have completed the course over the years as a gap year prior to or post-university. Some have gone back to their original careers and some have realised a passion for youth work with the added bonus of being able to use their outdoor instruction qualifications. An important part of the year is the opportunity for personal Christian growth and in insight into the value of outdoor activities in Christian ministry.

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What is included in the price?

- All **food and accommodation** for the whole year (except holidays)
- **Coaching** and practice in all of the activities listed above

What is not included in the price?

- **Maps and map cases** for the Summer Mountain Leader training and assessment courses
- Any **specialist clothing** or equipment you may want to purchase
- There is the option to travel to **Poland** to assist on a 2 week summer kids camp - students who choose to go will take part in a fund raising activity to cover the travel costs.

How does the programme work?

A typical day will start with breakfast followed by a short daily meeting. A full day of coaching or un-coached practice time will follow with a review of the day and dinner on return to the centre. During an NGB course, there may be evening input from the visiting coach.

Trainee Instructors will be part of the morning "thought for the day" rota and will also take an active part in weekly team fellowship meetings and the local youth work which the centre has an involvement in.

There will be two days off per week, usually at weekends which are free time, but it is expected that course participants will spend the time refining skills and taking some rest!

Abernethy operates 4 Christian adventure activity centres and a bunkhouse in Scotland along with a Swiss winter ski base. The School of Adventure Leadership is in its 20th year of operation and is home to our flagship one year fully residential Adventure Activity Instructor Training Course.
